2. <u>PUBLIC COMMENT</u>

Speaking under public comment **Ms Delores Thomas** advised the meeting that she was a property owner on the south end of Riverside Drive and had suffered substantial flood damage to her property during the flooding in 1976 and February 2004. She reported that, after consultation with other property owners in her immediate area, it appears that insurance companies are not insuring homes in that area and as a result the value of properties has reduced.

She requested the meeting to give urgent consideration to house raising those houses identified as being particularly vulnerable to further flooding.

She advised the meeting that she had personally suffered a significant financial loss as a result of the last flood.

The Chair thanked Ms Thomas for her comments and advised that officers will investigate this issue and prepare a report to the Committee on how many houses are affected and a recommendation on how to proceed from here. See Resolution (ii) of **Minute No. WSAC 070105.**

5. <u>WAIWHETU STREAM FLOODPLAIN MANAGEMENT STUDY</u> <u>VIABILITY OF SOURCE CONTROL</u> (AD35-18-1 / N/03/21/01)

The Project Manager presented his report and introduced the representatives from URS to make a presentation on the Management Study of the Viability of Source Control.

Mr J Easther of URS New Zealand Limited presented the results of the investigation to the Committee.

The report considered all phases of the investigation and presented a number of options to the Committee for consideration.

It was suggested that URS New Zealand attend a Hutt City Council meeting and make this presentation as all issues pertain to Lower Hutt City. The Chair requested officers arrange this as soon as possible.

There is a tight timeframe for Hutt City Council as the District Plan is being worked on and it is important that this issue is included to ensure consistency.

The Biodiversity Coordinator from Greater Wellington Regional Council updated the Committee on the progress since the application was submitted.

He advised that a meeting date of March 6 had been secured with the Minister for the Environment, Mayor Ogden and GW Chair Buchanan to progress this issue.

He also advised that there had been a meeting with officers of the MfE to discuss the funding application and that indications were that MfE would be prepared to help fund the project to 40% of the requested amount. This equated to about \$1.2 million for this financial year and a further \$1.2 million for the next financial year.

It was agreed by the Committee that precedents set by previous funding applications around the country indicated this important issue had significant reasons to be considered as a special project for funding and therefore should attract a larger amount of funding.

The Committee agreed they would contact Hon T Mallard to discuss this further and officers would proceed with further discussion with the MfE.
