4. <u>WAIWHETU STREAM FLOODPLAIN MANAGEMENT STUDY</u> <u>COMPLETION OF PHASE 2 AND THE WAY FORWARD</u> (AD35-18-1 /N/03/21/01)

Report No. WSAC2007/2/1 by the Project Manager – circulated pages 1-6.

The Project Manager and Graeme Campbell (GWRC) spoke to the report advising the Committee of the remaining tasks and timeframe to complete the Waiwhetu Floodplain Management Plan.

Cr Styles and Mayor Ogden raised concerns that the project appeared to have slowed and enquired as to what work could be done to speed up the project.

The financial and logistical restraints that the project faced were explained by councillors and officers from GWRC as well as outlining current funding negotiations with the Ministry for the Environment. Discussion resulted in the suggestion that local politicians would act together to advance the case for more funding with the MfE. Cr Evans underlined the importance of doing this carefully, and to look into other contaminated sites that had received more than 60% of possible MfE funding.

5. <u>WAIWHETU STREAM FLOODPLAIN MANAGEMENT STUDY</u> <u>UPPER CATCHMENT PROTECTION AND CHANNEL</u> <u>IMPROVEMENTS</u> (AD35-18-1 / N/03/21/01)

Report No. WSAC2007/2/1 by the Project Manager – circulated pages 7 - 31.

The Project Manager presented his report and introduced the representative from URS to make a presentation on the Management Study of Upper Catchment Protection and Channel Improvements.

Karen Muldowney briefed the Committee on the key points of the Upper Catchment Protection Report. Sam Willis spoke to the key points of the Channel Improvement Study.

Councillors enquired into the amount of physical work (e.g. debris clean up work) that can be undertaken presently by HCC officers. Mr Sherlock advised the councillors that council officers will find elements that can be undertaken and carry out the work necessary.

Cr Glensor asked HCC officers what provisions are in place for site development for adding sediment traps, and could HCC staff undertake the clearing of these traps. Mr Sherlock advised that there was a programme in place for both the provision of adding traps, and for the clearing of them. There is however, limited enforcement for installing sediment traps on new developments.

Mr Roberts suggested that part of the Excell (contractors) contract could be allocated towards the cleaning of litter from lower Waiwhetu Stream.

The Project Manager delivered his report on the Waiwhetu Floodplain Management Study. Mr Porteous and Mr Sherlock gave a debrief of the funding meeting held with MfE representatives.

Cr Glensor stressed the importance of carrying out the consultation properly. Public need to be presented with real and plausible options with explicit costs. This process should not suffer at the expense of haste.

GW Councillors pointed out that new councillors (elected at October elections) will need to look realistically at what goes into the next LTCCP.
